## What does 'Kirtan' mean?

The root of kirtan is *kirt* (Sanskrit: कोर्त्त).<sup>(16)</sup> The root is found in the Samhitas, the Brahmanas and other Vedic literature, as well as the Vedanga and Sutras literature. *Kirt*, according to Monier-Williams contextually means, "to mention, make mention of, tell, name, call, recite, repeat, relate, declare, communicate, commemorate, celebrate, praise, glorify".<sup>(17)</sup>

Kirtan, sometimes referred to as *sankirtana* (literally, "collective performance"),<sup>[18]</sup> is a call-andresponse chanting or musical conversation, a genre of religious performance arts that developed during India's *bhakti* devotional traditions.

- So Kirtan can be roughly translated as 'singing the Divine names'

And in singing the Divine names, we align with the qualities of the aspect[s] of the Divine embodied within that name or deity
